



#### PRAYER OF THE DAY


Let us pray.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> The Verse of the Day or the Gospel Acclamation are usually sung here. It is hard to conceive of a more fitting song or verse than that sung by the angels.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup> Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. <sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it. 6 There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. <sup>8</sup> He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. 9 The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world. <sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognize Him. <sup>11</sup> He came to that which was His own, but His own did not receive Him. 12 Yet to all who received Him, to those who believed in His name. He gave the right to become children of God—<sup>13</sup> children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. 14 The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. 15 John testifies concerning Him. He cries out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because He was before me.' " 16 From the fullness of His grace we have all received one blessing after another. <sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, Who is at the Father's side, has made Him known.

#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

Excerpts from the Athanasian Creed <sup>8</sup>

It is necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ took on human flesh. Now this is the true Christian faith.

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and He is man, born in time from the nature of His mother,

fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh.

equal to the Father as to His deity, less than the Father as to His humanity; and though He is both God and man, Christ is not two persons, but one,

one, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God; one, indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person;

for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there will come to judge the living and the dead.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> Athanasius was a staunch defender of the faith in the fourth century. He assisted the church in defending against two heresies. One denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other denied that Jesus was true God and true man in one person.
