Easter Sunrise Service

Easter Sunrise April 20, 2025 – 6:30am

Notes Regarding Our Service:

After the horror of Good Friday, the disciples thought they were defeated. Their Lord was dead and with Him, His promises ... or so they thought. The joy and confidence of Jesus' Resurrection would come slowly for them. For the strengthening of our faith, we will once more study the Resurrection this morning. HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN, INDEED! ALLELUIA!

As you prepare for worship this morning, there is no pre-service music. This silence reminds us of the quiet of the grave, within which our Savior laid for three days. We begin our service, much like the women that first Easter morning, in the darkness of grief.

However, the sound of mourning begins to fade as the narration begins to recall the Resurrection. The music also announces the Resurrection and calls us to worship. During our singing, of Hymn #453, the candles and the Paschal Candle (a symbol of the Resurrection) are lit.

The Paschal Candle (the large candle by the lectern) burns throughout the 50 days of Easter (today until Pentecost) and represents the Risen Lord shining in the splendor of His resurrection among His people. We also light it for baptisms (Romans 6) and funerals (John 11:25), as we rejoice in the hope, comfort, and victory the Resurrection brings.

BELLS

A voice in the darkness:

This morning we recall the first Easter morning. Through Word and song we remember the events that took place early in the morning. We experience again the joy that overwhelmed the hearts of those believing women and our Lord's disciples.

The disciples did not understand or believe that Jesus would rise from the dead. They thought that His death meant the end of all their hopes. Because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, they spent the day huddled behind locked doors.

The women also were not expecting Jesus to rise from the dead. On the first day of the week, after the Sabbath day of rest had ended, they left their homes and walked to our Lord's grave. There they intended to perform one last act of loving service by tending to His dead body with spices. Their hearts were filled with grief and sorrow. All they knew was that Jesus, the one in whom they had put their trust, was dead.

Sometime after sunset on the Sabbath, Jesus' rose from death. He left the still-sealed tomb. He then descended into hell. As the victorious Savior, He visited the abode of the damned, where He proclaimed His victory over Satan. The Bible tells us that He disarmed the powers of evil and "made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross."

No one knew that Jesus had risen yet. Shortly before sunrise, there was an earthquake. The soldiers standing guard fainted and then ran back to the city. An angel rolled the stone away from the entrance to the tomb to show the world its emptiness.



Exodus 15:1-11

The Lord saved Israel in the waters of the Red Sea and gave the Israelites a new identity - not slaves, but God's special people and chosen nation.


Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord: "I will sing to the Lord, for he is highly exalted. The horse and its rider he has hurled into the sea. ² The Lord is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation. He is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him. ³ The Lord is a warrior; the Lord is his name. ⁴ Pharaoh's chariots and his army he has hurled into the sea. The best of Pharaoh's officers are drowned in the Red Sea. ⁵ The deep waters have covered them; they sank to the depths like stone. ⁶ Your right hand, O Lord, was majestic in power. Your right hand, O Lord, shattered the enemy. ⁷ In the greatness of your majesty you threw down those who opposed you. You unleashed your burning anger; it consumed them like stubble. ⁸ By the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up. The surging waters stood firm like a wall; the deep waters congealed in the heart of the sea.

⁹ "The enemy boasted, 'I will pursue, I will overtake them. I will divide the spoils; I will gorge myself on them. I will draw my sword and my hand will destroy them.' ¹⁰ But you blew with your breath, and the sea covered them. They sank like lead in the mighty waters. ¹¹ "Who among the gods is like you, O Lord? Who is like you — majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, working wonders?

Colossians 3:1-4

Our new identity includes a type of glory that, for now, is hidden from the world. That glory will be revealed when our Lord returns on the Last Day.

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. ³ For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

Crown Him Lord This Easter Day By Don Besig & Nancy Price GOSPEL LESSON John 20:1-18

The first appearance of Jesus after His resurrection was to Mary of Magdala.

Our new identity: "my brothers."

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!" ³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. 4 Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips oflinen lying there but did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. 8 Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. 9 (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) 10 Then the disciples went back to their homes, 11 but Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb 12 and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. 13 They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." 14 At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. 15 "Woman," he said, "why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' " 18 Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

Dear Heavenly Father, we confess that it was our sin that caused Your Son to suffer and die. We admit that we deserve Your punishment for all eternity for our lives. We praise You eternally that You did not treat us as we deserved but that You sent Your Son, Jesus Christ, to free us from sin's chains and death's strong grip.

(Sung all) I know that my Redeemer lives; What comfort this sweet sentence gives! He lives, He lives, who once was dead; He lives, my ever-living Head. He lives triumphant from the grave, He lives eternally to save,

He lives eternally to save, He lives all glorious in the sky, He lives exalted there on high. (CW #441:1-2)

Gracious God, we ask as Your redeemed children that You would continue to guide us in this life. Direct us repeatedly to Your Word and Sacraments that we may be strengthened in faith as Your Holy Spirit works through them in our hearts and lives. Make us every day more and more like You until we enjoy our own resurrections into heavenly glory.

(sung women only) He lives to bless me with His love, He lives to plead for me above. He lives my hungry soul to feed, He lives to help in time of need.

He lives to grant me rich supply, He lives to guide me with His eye, He lives to comfort me when faint, He lives to hear my soul's complaint. (CW #441:3-4)

Lord of all life and death, Guide the people of this world to the true comfort and lasting peace that can only be found in Your Word. When trouble or hardship come into this life direct them and us to that Word and the blessed assurance that You work for the good of all who love You. We come also on behalf of all those who are sick during this blessed Easter. Give them the true assurance that You can heal them in body and soul. But if it is Your will to call them to Yourself, give them and their

loved ones the comfort in knowing that those who die in the Lord never really die but awake in heaven with You.

(sung men only) He lives to silence all my fears, He lives to wipe away my tears He lives to calm my troubled heart, He lives all blessings to impart.

He lives, my kind, wise, heavenly Friend, He lives and loves me to the end; He lives, and while He lives, I'll sing; He lives, my Prophet, Priest, and King. (CW #441:5-6)

Finally, O Lord, we ask You to direct our lives to sing praises to Your name that the ends of the earth may hear of Your glorious deeds and praise You for all eternity. We come in confidence because of the message of the cross and the empty tomb.

(sung all) He lives and grants me daily breath;
He lives, and I shall conquer death:
He lives my mansion to prepare;
He lives to bring me safely there.
He lives, all glory to His Name!
He lives, my Jesus, still the same.
