A Summer with the Apostles' Creed

The last two summers, we have taken time to review some of the Catechism's teachings. We have worked through the 10 Commandments (2022) & the Lord's Prayer (2023). This summer we make our way through the Apostles Creed.

Our Catechism announces, "A creed is a statement that expresses what people believe and teach. The Apostles' Creed was not written by the apostles, but it is a statement of faith that expresses the truths taught by the Apostles. It can be traced back to the third century."

Like the Nicene Creed (adopted in A.D. 325) and the Athanasian (written about A.D. 500), Creeds are important as the Church throughout history confesses the truth and seeks to defend the truth of what the Bible teaches about God.

As we study the Apostles' Creed, we will have the opportunity to rejoice in the Gospel message, the good news of what our Triune God has done and continues to do for us, His Church here on earth. Each section of the Creed will then highlight one of the Persons of the Holy Trinity and their ongoing work on our behalf.

We'll kick things off the first weekend in June (except for that Saturday - Don Buch will be with us as Pastor Kampman's presence has been requested at a wedding reception that evening). We will start with the first article as we consider the work of God, the Father Almighty. He lovingly created and sustains everything which means YOU were lovingly made for a specific purpose in this life. Talk about granting purpose and importance to the gift of life we have been given!
