Advent Gathering Rite 2023

The pastor speaks words in regular print.

The congregation responds with words in bold print.

Italicized words are sung. Join in as comfortable.

Music will play throughout our gathering rite except during the Absolution to highlight the work of the coming King for us.

Invocation

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Prepare the Royal Highway; the King of kings is near! Let ev'ry hill and valley a level road appear! Then great the King of glory, foretold in sacred story: Hosanna to the Lord, for He fulfills God's Word!

Prepare the Royal Highway #302:1

Confession

Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

Blessed is the one whose sin the Lord does not count against them.

God's people, see Him coming: your own eternal King!
Palm branches strew before Him!
Spread garments! Shout and sing!
God's promise will not fail you! No more shall doubt assail you!
Hosanna to the Lord, for He fulfills God's Word!

Prepare the Royal Highway #302:2

Let us confess our sins to the Lord.

Holy God, gracious Father, I am sinful by nature and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved others as I should. I deserve your punishment both now and forever. But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with his innocent suffering and death. Trusting in him, I pray; God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Then fling the gates wide open to greet your promised King!
Your King, yet ev'ry nation its tribute too should bring.
All lands, bow down before Him! All nations, now adore Him!
Hosanna to the Lord, for He fulfills God's Word!

Prepare the Royal Highway #302:3

Our gracious Father in heaven has been merciful to us. He sent His only Son, Jesus Christ, Who gave His life as the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel
That mourns in lowly exile here until the Son of the God appear.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel #327:1

We light one Advent candle, remembering Jesus, who is coming near. He will come to gather his people from everywhere, both the living and the dead. He is coming to save us.

We remember Jesus, who will come at the end of time. None of us know what day that will be.

We hear his call to watch.

We light one Advent candle as a sign of our watchfulness and waiting.

When Jesus Christ came into our world, he hid His glory and power. He humbled Himself so that sinners would be drawn to Him rather than driven away in fear. He came to save us!

He will come again in power and glory to take us to be with Him forever in heaven.

One blue Advent candle is lit as we sing a stanza of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

O, come, O high exalted King, Salvation for Your people bring! Prepared we stand upon Your Word, Your joyous promises are heard. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to you, O Israel!

Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains would tremble before you! ²As when fire sets twigs ablaze and causes water to boil, come down to make your name known to your enemies and cause the nations to quake before you! ³For when you did awesome things that we did not expect, you came down, and the mountains trembled before you. 4Since ancient times no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who acts on behalf of those who wait for him. 5You come to the help of those who gladly do right, who remember your ways. But when we continued to sin against them, you were angry. How then can we be saved? ⁶All of us have become like one who is unclean. and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away. 7No one calls on your name or strives to lay hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us and made us waste away because of our sins. 8Yet, O LORD, you are our Father. We are the clay, you are the potter; we are all the work of your hand. ⁹Do not be angry beyond measure, O LORD; do not remember our sins forever. Oh, look upon us, we pray, for we are all your people.

Gospel: *Mark* 11:1-10

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, ² saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.' " ⁴ They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, ⁵ some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" ⁶ They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. ⁷ When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. ⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. ⁹ Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!"

SERMON

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian* and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

(*The original text here reads "catholic," a word meaning "universal." The Church consists of all believers in heaven and on earth, of every time in history.)
