Worry: Times like this can consume people with worry. One of St. Paul's members, now in heaven, used to quote author Erma Bombeck's famous line: "Worry is like a rocking chair. It gives you something to do but never gets you anywhere." In Scripture Jesus directs us, "Do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own" (Matt 6:34). Martin Luther used a little bird as an example for us: "You sleep in your little nest at night without any worry. In the morning you arise, are joyous and of good cheer, sit on a tree and sing, praise, and thank God. Then you go in search of food and find it. For shame! Why have I, old fool that I am, not learned to do the same thing -- I, who have so much reason to do so?" And this is what King David wrote, "Cast your cares on the Lord and he will sustain you; he will never let the righteous fall" (Psalm 55:22). Our Savior God carries his forgiven people in his own strong hands! We can be sure that while we cannot control the events in the passage of our lives, our gracious, powerful Lord absolutely does. He tells us the one thing we need to know about our futures: in Christ's victory over sin and death heaven is our home.
