FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: HE LIVES TO BE MY GOOD SHEPHERD

Every culture has the concept of an ideal citizen, someone who typifies its values. For much of the United States' history, the ideal citizen was the American farmer: hardworking, innovative, and vital to our collective well-being. Even some of our first presidents were farmers.

For the people of Israel, the farmer wasn't their ideal citizen. It was the shepherd. Sheep were an invaluable source of clothing and food. But they were hard to keep in the Judean countryside. Its sparse grasslands are intermixed with desert. For sheep, food is sparse, but predators are plenteous. The survival of sheep was dependent on their shepherd. There he is. Weather-beaten. Sleepless. Armed. In the dusk, he scans the land, counting his sheep, making sure they are all accounted for, every one of them on his heart. You see why Jesus chose the shepherd to illustrate how he cares for us. He feeds us with His Word. He protects us from that roaring lion, Satan. Jesus is leading us into the green pasture of eternal life. For centuries, the Church has observed this Fourth Sunday of Easter to celebrate that he lives to be our Good Shepherd.

April Voter's Meeting Highlights

We also discussed our shortfall and how best to bring it to the congregation's attention and monitor it in the future as we seek to meet the commitments made in our January Voter's Meeting. So far this year the total deficit has equaled \$41,000. We are asking all members to prayerfully consider their offerings and if possible increase the current amount given to reflect the increases we voted in at our January Meeting. Every dollar given is a blessing from our God as we seek to use those gifts wisely and the glory of His name. *Special Deficit Reduction envelopes are available at the information center by the hearing loop headsets should you wish to make a gift over and above your regular offerings.*

We ratified changes to the budget to reflect the called workers that are coming in. Total changes brought down our projected budget number by around \$3,000.

We extended Mr. Mathwig's provisional call for another year while he works on licensure and synod certification. It was noted that he has been doing an excellent job since joining our faculty.

We authorized a new roof for the parsonage from improvement funds (\$20,000). The work will be done by Kottke Construction in the coming months.

At his request, we changed Mr. Aaron Hartwig's housing allowance (this has no budgetary impact but is for tax purposes only).
