Palm Sunday (April 4 & 5, 2020)

God's Word this week: Hail the King who humbly comes to save us. For 1,700 years the Church has celebrated this festival that opens Holy Week. Jesus entered Jerusalem to the sounds of praise and adoration of the people there. Laying palm branches and their cloaks in the road, the people honored the prophet from Nazareth as their Savior. Some surely saw their Savior from sin; others likely saw their earthly savior from the Romans and foreign rule. But either way, the songs of exultation rose: "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" The appointed readings this week are Zechariah 9:9,10; Philippians 2:5-11; and Matthew 21:1-11. A plea/reminder: It is hoped that all of us will take very seriously the directives given us by our national and state leaders to implement measures to stop the spread of this debilitating and sometimes deadly virus. With community spread now occurring in Fond du Lac County, we all need to act as if we have the *virus* and could pass it on to others. This is the loving thing to do so that we are not responsible for its further spread to our families or neighbors. Currently, this is the only weapon we have to combat it. "Safer at home," except for necessities, means just what it says: We are safer at home or in our private office apart from others. This will ultimately also end the threat sooner, shorten the time of our separation, and get people back to work again. A history lesson about the Spanish flu outbreak of 1918 shows us that those who survived were those who stayed home. Also, while the Lord's Supper is a wonderful gift from the Savior, it is also difficult to distribute it safely at the present time (touching items, keeping one's distance, even disinfecting the building after people enter and leave). Please remember that our members in the military must often go for months without communion being available. During those times, they are encouraged to go even more frequently to the Word. The Gospel is in the Word in all its power, through which the Holy Spirit strengthens our faith and reassures us of God's forgiving love. There are many scriptural resources available to us at home and online. Please use God's Word regularly, even daily! "Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor my covenant of peace be removed,' says the LORD, who has compassion on you" (Isaiah 54:10).

Quotes from Luther: "In times of trial we should learn to judge not by our feelings but by the Word of God. This Word promises us that every trial is only the eventide upon which the morning of comfort follows. But our flesh does the opposite and, disregarding the Word, directs its attention only to the present feeling of affliction and judges by that feeling. Therefore it cannot conceive of the end of the trial in its heart." He says in another place, "Dwell on the Word, not on your worries."
