#### It has been a truly busy summer here at St. Paul's.

- The Board of Trustees was active filling positions within our school. We are excited to install Mr. Joel Mathwig at our Sunday Service next week (August 21). Joel possesses a bachelor's degree and has already begun pursuing licensure in elementary education. We also welcome Katie Schwartz to our staff. She will serve as an aide for our preschoolers and kindergarteners.
- The Board of Properties has been doing upkeep around the facility. The parking lot's cracks were sealed and then it was coated and striped. Weeds were battled and the lawn mowed. A new water softener should soon be installed in the church and the air conditioning units should soon be leveled after settling has left them crooked, placing stress on the pipes going into the building. Fire systems were inspected and batteries replaced. A leak in the gym roof was patched.
- Our Board of Elders has been making phone calls as we encourage our members to remain connected to the Word of God in worship and reviewing the synod's Peter Plan in hopes of having an established system for that work.
- Our Board of Christian Education and staff have been hard at work too. The gym floor was recoated. The gym closet was reorganized. Our 7&8 grade room recarpeted. The classroom floors were stripped and waxed and hallways were burnished. New interactive displays were installed throughout the building (classrooms & meeting rooms!!). New Chromebooks and tablets with carts for them are in every classroom.
- Teachers have been busy in faculty meetings, preparing rooms (physically & academically), attending conferences, communicating with parents, and trying to get a little rest for the coming year.
- Our pastors have been busy making calls, visits, preparing services (regular worship, Worship at the Cross, weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc.), and having classes, not to mention preparing for Catechism, Sunday School, and Adult Bible Classes this coming year. Did you know that we welcomed 10 new members last month?
- VBS and 700 flyers for it, our church, and school were delivered.
- A Grand Piano was purchased to replace our parlor grand which was beginning to show its age.

That's just in the building. Preparations for choir, chimes, WinGs, Boys and Girls Pioneers have no doubt also been in the works. We thank everyone who has worked so hard over the summer. It wouldn't be possible to get nearly as much done if not for your help and support.

#### VBS & Movie Night Thank You's

We are truly thankful for the many people who gave of themselves to make VBS happen. It's always a blast to see so many young people gather around the Word of God for a fun-filled week with their Savior. We are also thankful for the efforts of those who planned and organized St. Paul's Movie Night in coordination with our Christian Education Society. The fellowship hall was pretty full as we watched Ferdinand. It was truly a blessing to watch so many interact with one another.
