



His birth changes everything for his people. The child of light entered into this sin-darkened world and shone the brightness of God's love upon all people: "*Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord* (Luke 2:11 – the Verse of the Day)." A GATHERING RITE FOR CHRISTMAS EVE

"What Child Is This" (#67) plays softly throughout

Minister: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation: Amen.

M: We have come into the presence of God, Who created us to love and to serve him as His dear children. But we have disobeyed Him and deserve only His wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to Him and plead for His mercy.

Sung: What child is this who, laid to rest,
On Mary's lap is sleeping?
Whom angels greet With anthems sweet
While shepherds watch are keeping?
This, this is Christ the King,
Whom shepherds guard and angels sing.
Haste, haste to bring him laud,
The babe, the Son of Mary! (67:1)

All (spoken): Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed You in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve Your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Where oxen now are feeding?
Good Christians, fear; For sinners here
The silent Word is pleading.
Nails, spear shall pierce him through;
The cross he'll bear for me, for you.

The Gospel Lesson: The Savior Is Born Luke 2:1-7

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to his own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

- Men: When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."
- Women: So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.
- All: When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child,
- Men: and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.
- Women: But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.

All: The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.
