Christmas Eve and Day

At Christmas, we celebrate the birth of our Savior Jesus into the world. "⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. (1 John 4:9-10)" God's Son took on flesh to live, die, and rise again that you might have the gift of forgiveness of sins, a life lived wrapped in the assurances of God and Hope of Salvation, heaven forever with God. Those are facts worth celebrating!

As for the date, December 25, the historical reason is uncertain. Some have posited that it was chosen as a counterpoint to a pagan Roman festival. Another theory puts Christmas nine months after March 25, the vernal equinox which was usually the celebration of the Annunciation to Mary (when the angel gave Mary the news that she would give birth to the Son of God).
