**Advent 1** 

THE KING SHALL COME: HE IS COMING TO SAVE US

Rulers plan, administrate, and govern. They typically do not save. If your house is on fire, it will not be the mayor who shows up to save you from the flames. If America were attacked, the President would serve as the commander in chief of the armed forces. The President would not pick up a weapon, go to the front lines, and fight to save you from the enemy.

Jesus is different. He is both infinitely greater than all other rulers, yet also infinitely humbler. He does not consider it beneath His rank as King to risk His life for His subjects. He is willing to fight for us. He is willing to die for us. Our King Jesus came into our world for one reason – to save us.

### Year-End Giving: Qualified Charitable Distributions

A tax-efficient way to support the ministry here at St. Paul's

If you're age 70.5 and older, you can support St. Paul's by requesting a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) directly to St. Paul's. Even better: If you are age 72 and older, the QCD will count toward your required minimum distribution! Qualified Charitable Distributions (up to \$100,000 per person per year) are excluded from taxable income! Please contact your tax professional or WELS Planned Giving to learn how you can make a tax-wise gift to St. Paul's, the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, or Winnebago Lutheran Academy.
