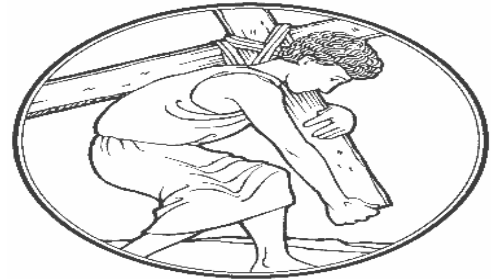

Stewardship Thoughts

In writing to the Corinthians about the offerings being gathered for the needy in Jerusalem, Paul stated, "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loved the cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7,8).
