#### Stewardship thought from our Epistle Lesson: 2 Cor. 12:7b-10

Sometimes God adds by taking things away. Although God's equation might seem painful for us, he always has a purpose. He increased Paul's reliance on the Lord by taking away physical comfort. While we can't always understand why God allows us to experience losses in our lives—the loss of money, possessions, health, loved ones, and even our lives—we know that the Lord is constantly calling us to rely on him more fully and to trust in him more deeply. Faith in Jesus is leaning solely on his love and depending on his power alone.
