Stewardship Moment: Jesus gave the gift of time. Do we ever read that he was too busy to talk to someone, to heal someone, or to show compassion to someone? One of the most tender passages of Scriptures deals with Jesus' love for children. Although he was exhausted from teaching the crowds, when parents brought their children to him he welcomed them. When the disciples tried to set their Master's priorities for him, telling parents to take their children away, Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them" (Lk. 18:16). Jesus was generous with his time. (*Stewards Living a God-pleasing Life,* R. Chewning, 2000, p. 39)

- Q. Why is it important to have a regular connection to God's Word?
- A. Because it's **God's** Word! The Spirit uses it to create faith in the Savior and keep our faith strong. Faith is more than knowing who Jesus is (even the devil knows that). Faith is confidence that Jesus died for my sins and, because of it, when I die I'll go to heaven.
- Q. Can't I read the Bible by myself?
- A. Absolutely! God encourages daily study of his Word individually and in our families. But, do I actually do that? And if so, do I understand and believe the passages in which God directs his people to worship together with fellow believers?
- Q. How do we know that God wants us to gather with fellow Christians for worship?
- A. God tells us this *many* ways in his Word. For example, Jesus chose disciples and sent them out to establish Christian congregations. In fact, it was Jesus himself who "gave some to be pastors and teachers to prepare God's people for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up..." (Eph. 4:11). Why would he give pastors and teachers to the world unless he intended for them to do their jobs in the congregations to which they are called? Also, Christians need each other! In our spiritually perilous world, we need to lean on each other and unselfishly, lovingly encourage one another: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another...as you see the Day (of Judgment) approaching" (Heb. 10:25).
