Did you know that each month our pastors typically visit around 30 of our members in their homes, nursing homes, and senior living communities? They bring the Lord's Supper and devotion with them to these members who would love to be in worship each week but just are not able due to health or disability. The "Shut-In List" is available at one of the information centers. A card, a call, or even a visit would make these members feel remembered, appreciated, and loved. A special thanks to those who already do. We often hear about how truly appreciated it is.

Pastoral Visits to Hospitals

Our pastors also stand at the ready to come and visit in hospitals. We know that these can often be uncertain, frightening, and lonely times. While doctors take care of your physical needs, we can check in and make sure your spiritual needs are also being met. We bring devotional materials, the Lord's Supper, and one—on—one devotions to your bedside as you recover. In most cases, pastors are not considered visitors but are treated like hospital staff who can visit over and above the set visiting regulations. Unfortunately, hospitals often do not contact us for you. If you or a loved one is in the hospital, please contact the office or call a pastor directly. We promise if we know you are there, you'll see us.

Pastoral Counseling

If you have questions about what God's Word has to say about a certain topic or situation, or if you just need a friendly voice to help you work through the burdens of life, our pastors would love to talk. They can offer advice on spiritual matters and help get you connected with the right people if something goes beyond that. Conversations are always private, though our pastors do reserve the right to consult with one another.
