God's Word This Week

Epiphany 1: The Baptism of Our Lord

So often what our eyes see differs from what God decrees. This is true of the life of Jesus. In the eyes of the world, He was nothing special. This is also true in the life of the Christian. To the world, the believer does not look more blessed than the unbeliever. In fact, the believer may appear to have more hardships as the devil and his allies attempt to destroy him. So, to assure His children, God connects His grace, power, and blessing to something we can see – a visible sign: the anointing of baptism, His means of grace.

Annual Voter's Meeting

We thank our voters for the time they gave as we talked about finances. By God's grace, we ended the year \$9,000 short of our budget figure but we also underspent the budget by \$74,000. Seeking to acknowledge our current climate and fulfill various obligations (mortgages, wla, missions, etc.), our budget for next year was set at \$887,240.42, a 1.83% rise over last year's numbers. The increase is mainly due to our commitment to pay our called workers at synod code. Housing numbers are slowly being adjusted to reach 100% of the synod suggested amount. We are currently at 90%. Agendas are on the information center.
