God's Word This Week:

Epiphany 3

FROM THE RIVER TO THE MOUNTAIN: THE KINDNESS OF HIS CALLING We try to hide our faults and failures from others. We want people to see us at our best. Perhaps we assume that if people knew what we were really like, they would want nothing to do with us. There's no hiding anything from God. He is all-seeing and all-knowing. Christ Jesus has witnessed our very worst, even the sins that only occurred in our heads. The psalmist says, "You perceive my thoughts from afar. You are familiar with all my ways" (139:2,3). Yet even though Jesus knows all our faults and failures, he badly wants something to do with us. So, he calls us to follow him. He wants us to be with him, secure in his love of forgiveness. Here is this week's epiphany: Jesus shows kindness when he calls us to discipleship. More, he shows kindness by giving us the ability to answer that call, so that we might always be near him and his blessing.

Annual Voter's Meeting Recap

At our Annual Voters Meeting last Sunday, we went over the membership changes that had occurred over the year here at St. Paul's. In 2023, we lost 29 members. 13 because they went home to be with Jesus, 9 transferred to other WELS Churches, 7 were released from membership. We gained 45 members: 26 transferred in from other churches, 9 births, 4 adult confirmations, and 6 through profession of faith. That means our membership went up in 2023 from 876 to 892. Of course, this is a blessing from our Lord to see numerical growth, but we are happy simply to serve in the kingdom regardless of what the statistics might say.

Our *Elders* have been faithfully contacting members either by phone or by mail whom we haven't seen in a while. Our *Board of Christian Education* has been working on shoring things up after Covid and our faculty has been working hard on everything from core subjects and learning to student mental health. Our *Board of Properties* has been busy with various improvements in and out of the building.

The big-ticket item at our January meeting was the year's budget. We worked hard to mitigate the growing costs of just about everything. We moved from insurance plan 2, which we have used for years, to plan 4 (a high deductible plan) to save what may be as much as \$40,000 in insurance costs (Actually more! If we had done nothing our costs were going up 11%). We lowered our synodical pledge for the year by \$9,000 to \$39,482 so that we were in line with 10% giving across our commitments to Synod and WLA which went up 2% after three years of keeping things the same to \$57,402. The result was a modest increase of about 2% from last year's budget. The new budget is \$820,617. We consider this a win given that costs are rising rapidly all around us. We also will be sending out a letter to the congregation to encourage regular attendance and stewardship in the days to come.

Unfortunately, when we refinanced the church loan, those costs went from 3% to 7% (\$156,884). Our 3-year commitment pledges end in 2024 which means another commitment will occur as this year winds down.

We ask the Lord of the Church to be with and bless us as we move forward this year. May we always hold Him and His Word close even as we hold it out to our congregation, community, and world. What a blessing to be able to work together in this task.

New Adult Bible Class: This We Believe

Our world is full of many voices telling us what to believe. It can be confusing, frustrating, and faith-destroying. What does God really say? How can I be certain? Adult Bible Classes will seek to find firm ground as we answer that question. We will be using *This We Believe* a booklet that is put out by our synod (WELS) seeking to explain the teachings of God's Holy Word. It is a basic overview of the truths given by God and offers Scriptural passages that explain why we do what we do. You can find it electronically at www.stpaulslutherannfdl.com/thiswebelieve.
