JESUS APPEARS AS THE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

The prophet Isaiah vividly described humanity as "people walking in darkness." We are completely enveloped by sin and suffering and death. Worse, when we honestly assess the content of our minds and hearts, we find darkness there too. However, the prophet also foretold that within this deep darkness, a light would shine. The light would be so brilliant that it would be impossible to miss. As Jesus began his teaching and preaching ministry, that prophecy was fulfilled.

Today Jesus continues to shine his light by preaching repentance and the good news of the nearing kingdom. He invites us to live a life that is illuminated by him. Something to think about

The following points on in-person worship are from an article from 2018.

1. Taking Communion, Worshipping, and Praying Together

Churches gather around the Means of Grace (the Gospel, Baptism, and Lord's Supper). These means give and strengthen faith as the Holy Spirit works through them. It's also a time when we can raise those in need to God as we worship and pray. Gathering together as the body of Christ for these rich blessings is a joy and a privilege. "All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (these meals included the Lord's Supper, and to prayer. ... They worshiped together at the Temple each day (Acts 2:42, 46).

2. Our Family of God

While the primary reason we worship is to be present as God gives us His blessings through the Means of Grace, we don't attend church solely for our own benefit. The early church understood that believers meeting together created community. You may find good teaching and truth online, but people crave face-to-face interaction as they develop relationships within the church body. We find meaningful interaction in serving the body of Christ, our spiritual family, and caring more about others than ourselves. "42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ... 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts." (Acts 2:42, 44-46a). "Christ is also the head of the church, which is his body" (Col. 1:18). "All of you together are Christ's body, and each of you is a part of it" (1 Cor. 12:27).

3. Accountability and Mentoring

The tendency today is to isolate ourselves in front of electronics where we interact with a screen instead of each other. Church is more than listening to a sermon. It's where you help others grow, partake in the Means of Grace, serve, give of your talents and spiritual gifts, mentor, and receive mentoring. Even our simple presence, as we are seen by fellow believers, serves as an encouragement to others and when we are not seen, others can "check in" in Christian love to make sure we are ok. "Let the message about Christ, in all its richness, fill your lives. Teach and counsel each other with all the wisdom he gives" (Col. 3:16).

4. Role Model for Children

The statistics repeatedly bear it out. Your children and grandchildren are learning from your actions. Our communities are watching too. We can teach by example that church is a privilege we never want to take for granted. "And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near" (Heb. 10:25).

Stewardship by the Lectionary: 1 John 2:3-11 (second lesson)

John reminds us of an old command, taught in the Old Testament: Love your neighbor as yourself. However, in Jesus this old command becomes new. We don't follow this command in the old way, as one of the hundreds of things we do to show we deserve God's kingdom. This command is made new in the love of Jesus for us who gave himself for us. Motivated and empowered by that gospel love, we want to love and serve others. We can do that personally as we take time to help others in need. We can do that on a broader scale by supporting WELS Christian Aid and Relief and the mission of our synod.
