God's Word This Week:

THE GIFT OF GOD ... IS FOR ALL PEOPLE!

On Christmas Eve the angel told the shepherds, "I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people" (Luke 2:10). One wonders if those words struck those Jewish shepherds as odd. For centuries, God had given special attention to one nation—Israel. There were Jewish religious leaders teaching that only members of that special people would be saved. Not according to the Christmas angel! The birth of the Savior was good news for all people.

Today we celebrate the Festival of the Epiphany. Epiphany comes from a Greek word meaning "reveal." When the Savior was born, he was first revealed to Israelites: the shepherds, Simeon, Anna. But today, we see the Lord miraculously guides foreigners across countless miles so the Savior could be revealed to them as well. How did the magi respond? "They were overjoyed" (Matthew 2:10). The Festival of Epiphany is sometimes known as "The Gentiles' Christmas." We Gentiles (non-Jews) rejoice in the good news that this Jewish baby is not just a gift for the Jews. He is a gift for all people—the Savior of the world.

Annual Voters Meeting with call meeting

Our annual budgetary voters meeting is set for *Tuesday, January 21 at 6:30 pm*. A Call meeting has also been scheduled for that meeting as we continue to extend calls for a principal.

What's been happening over break?

<u>Upgraded building security</u>: Atlas Communications installed cameras to keep watch on our parking lot and the main entry by the office. These cameras integrate with our door system as well allowing the five faculty members with the app (Pastors, Secretary, Athletic Director, & Principal) to view who is at the door even from home before buzzing them in. The cost was just a little over \$5,000.

<u>3-4 Grade Furnace Repair</u>: The 3-4 grade furnace's heat exchanger failed over break. It was thankfully under warranty, which meant Fondy Heating was able to replace it for just under \$1,000 instead of requiring us to purchase an entirely new unit.

Gifts given to the Improvement Fund help offset these expenses.

St. Paul's History - Pastor Wichmann (1944 - 1948)

Pastor Wilmar Wichmann assumed his duties at St. Paul's in November 1944. In April 1945, it was decided to call for a second teacher for the school. Lucille Sommer accepted the Call, beginning her service that September. A Pipe Organ Fund was begun in February 1946. Mr. Myron Hilger assumed duties as teacher and principal on June 16, 1946, having been called from Trinity Lutheran Church, Town of Liberty, near Manitowoc. Permission was granted by the voters to Mr. Hilger to organize a Parent-Teacher Association in April 1947. Pastor Wichmann asked to be released to serve Grace Congregation in Neenah, on June 8, 1948.
