This summer, as we work through the nine parts of the Lord's Prayer (Address, 7 Petitions, & Doxology), we pray the Lord will increase our love for this prayer and His work within our hearts and throughout the world. Want a deeper dive? Consider reading a small section (question) of Luther's Small Catechism each night for a devotional approach to continued study. The Fifth Petition is on pages 273-278 in the new deep blue catechism.

THE 5TH PETITION: FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US.

"I forgive you." They are spoken to the child, tears streaming down their cheeks, because of the naughtiness which has been on display. "I forgive you." They are words of one spouse to another as selfishness reared its head in marriage and "we" became "me". "I forgive you." They are words spoken from one friend to another after words too hastily spoken. "I forgive you." They are spoken by God Himself, through the mouth of His called servants, to His people each week after sins too numerous to recount and too embarrassing to mention. But may "I forgive you" never be empty words devoid of their meaning. They are words forever linked to the cross and the sacrifice made there for us: once, for all. They are life-changing words as we live in the reality they bring: sins paid for in full, guilt done away with forever, and a relationship with God restored. May we ever live in the freedom these words provide and may we share them with others in our lives, in our homes, and in our communities.

Faith is given and strengthened here. This is where God works on us, takes us to the cross, and forgives us. Because of what God does here, we want to be here. Wrapped in the Means of Grace, we are wrapped in the love of God as He pours His blessings out upon us.
