God's Word this week: Pentecost 9

The readings this week deepen the emphasis of last week. Some have called it "Orthodox Sunday" because of the emphasis on the pure Word; that's the Word Christ has given and by which he called us to be his own; that's the Word by which he strengthens us when we are worn out, humanly speaking, as a result of faithfulness to it, in all of its truth and purity. The appropriate response to the hearing of the pure Word is a clinging to it and sharing of it. Thereby Christ's faithfulness to us finds a response in our joyful faithfulness to him.
