God's Word This Week Trinity Sunday & the 1st Commandment

In worship this summer, we will take a look at the Ten Commandments of our God. We peer into the Law for three reasons: 1) that we may see the true depravity of our nature and our intense need for a Savior [mirror]. 2) That it may hem in the sinful nature within us all which seeks to run far adrift of all that God says is good and right [curb]. 3) That in love for the forgiveness Christ has won for us, we might seek to show our appreciation and strive to live the command in thanks and adoration [guide].

This week we consider the First Commandment, often called the chief commandment. As simple as it sounds, it is the hardest of them all to keep. If any other command of God falls, we have shattered the first. May we strive to keep God first in everything we think and say and do relying on Him for all! Yes, may we fear, love, and trust in God above all things!
