God's Word This Week

In worship this summer, we will take a look at the Ten Commandments of our God. We peer into the Law for three reasons: 1) that we may see the true depravity of our nature and our intense need for a Savior [mirror]. 2) That it may hem in the sinful nature within us all which seeks to run far adrift of all that God says is good and right [curb]. 3) That in love for the forgiveness Christ has won for us, we might seek to show our appreciation and strive to live the command in thanks and adoration [guide].

<u>This week we consider the Second Commandment</u>. Though this commandment is often given little attention today by our increasingly pagan society or even by most of Christianity, God takes His name seriously and for good reason. He has not given it to us to curse, prove a point, or even express our shock (OMG!). He has given it that we might be saved!

Sermon Text: "You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name. (Exodus 20:7)"

The Second Commandment & Explanation

As recorded in Luther's Small Catechism Copies available in the spining tract rack in the narthex.

Read in unison in place of the verse of the day.

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God. What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie or deceive, or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

Holy Communion

Today we have the privilege of receiving Christ's true body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine of Holy Communion. Through this sacrament, the Holy Spirit actually gives the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation for the strengthening of our faith. Scriptures also teach that as we commune together, we are publicly testifying to a complete unity of faith based on a confession of all of God's Word. St. Paul's Preschool Position

With the shortage in calls, we have gotten a little creative with our staffing for next year. The Board of Christian Education, in conjunction with the Trustees, decided that with a small Kindergarten class next year and a growing preschool, we could combine those two classrooms and hire a teaching assistant, to assist with the extra work.

This was desirable for a number of reasons:

- It allows for the Kindergarten students to have a "fuller classroom" granting more social activity throughout the day.
- A Lead Teacher and Teaching Assistant allow us to separate grades when necessary so that curriculum doesn't suffer and students still receive the education they require. Further insured by the fact that our Aide has a degree from MLC as well.
- It provides our Preschool with the two individuals recommended after our preschool eclipses 11 students (We currently have 11 enrolled and project to have as many as 17).
- It provides us with a little extra time to assess and determine our needs for the following school year and how best to fill them.

The last bullet is noteworthy. The hope is that our Preschool and Kindergarten will continue to grow. We want to break out the two classrooms the following year again with the hope of being able to fully staff both rooms (Kindergarten Teacher, Preschool Teacher and an Aide). As we currently see it, this is not a permanent solution but a bridge back to normal in this time of called worker shortages within our synod. It should be noted here that there were 110 unfilled requests from MLC this year with dozens of ECE positions that were not filled across our synod.

With all this in mind, we extended our teaching assistant position to Mrs. Katie Schwartz. Katie graduated from MLC in 1996 and has taught in Kindergarten and preschool settings in Saginaw, MI, Downers Grove, IL, and Fond du Lac, WI. Katie is married to Pastor Matthew Schwartz who serves at St. Luke's in Oakfield. They have been blessed with four children.

We are excited to be able to add Mrs. Schwartz to the teaching team for the coming year.
