²¹ Leaving that place, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. ²² A Canaanite woman from that vicinity came to him, crying out, "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on me! My daughter is suffering terribly from demon-possession." ²³ Jesus did not answer a word. So his disciples came to him and urged him, "Send her away, for she keeps crying out after us." ²⁴ He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel." ²⁵ The woman came and knelt before him. School & Sunday School Mission Offering

The 2nd semester School & Sunday School Mission Offering, collected weekly, is being given to Martin Luther College, our synod's called worker training school. We gathered \$636.99 for MLC this year.

Stewardship Moment: Mortgage (3 of 4)

From time to time, it is good for us to revisit how the ministry here at St. Paul's is funded. The answer: It is funded through generous offerings given by our members who support the work of the Gospel. We do this through four major funds. Starting the week of May 19, we'll review those four funds in the bulletin.

Mortgage

comprises \$3,017 of \$19,673 needed per week.

Anything given to this fund helps us pay for and move toward retiring the mortgage, which would free up a substantial amount of money for other ministry opportunities that are waiting in the wings. After last year's refinancing (done every three years on our commercial loan with NEBaT), our interest rate increased from 3.75% to 6.95%. While we are thankful that the rate increase wasn't higher, it does mark a substantial increase in our payment \$13,073.67 verses \$10,973.79 previously. Please prayerfully consider how you can adjust your weekly giving to this fund over and above your regular weekly giving as a result.
