God's Word This Week

3nd Commandment

Our summer series continues as we contemplate the Ten Commandments. As we use the Law as our curb, mirror, and guide, may it leave us at the foot of the cross where we see Jesus, our righteousness, the fulfillment of the Law for us. This week we finish the first table of the Law with the Third Commandment. Jesus often uses the picture of the bride and bridegroom as He talks about Himself and His Church. Would it be a healthy marriage if the bride told the groom, "I love you, but I only want to see you once a month"? Probably not! So God in the Third Commandment tells us to spend time with the Bridegroom where He has promised to be found, in the Word, in His Means of Grace.

Read in unison in place of the verse of the day.

The Third Commandment & Explanation

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and his Word, but regard it as holy, and gladly hear and learn it.

One hymn writer wrote, "*To your temple I draw near; Lord, I love to worship here. Here are sacrament and Word; here believers meet their Lord.*" (#226 CW93). In public worship, we are wrapped in the Means of Grace through which the Holy Spirit has promised to work whether recalling our Baptisms, contemplating the Word, sung or spoken, or receiving Holy Communion, the actual body and blood of Jesus and all that body and blood has done for us.
