# **Stewardship Thoughts**

As we reported at our April Voter's Meeting, our offerings have not kept pace with the budget approved in January. This has resulted in a \$41,000 shortfall over the first quarter of the year. Deficit reduction envelopes are available at the information center should you wish to make a special gift to help cover the shortfall.

Christian Stewardship has been defined as the free and joyous activity of the child of God in managing all of life, as well as life's resources, for our good and for God's glory. Christian stewardship is a lifelong process, beginning when we start to accumulate resources (frankly even before) and progressing through the end of our days. The Holy Scriptures speak of stewardship often. The Holy Scriptures presents several principles regarding stewardship.

A good summary passage can be found in 1 Corinthians 16:2, <u>On the first day of every week</u>, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made.

**Regular:** On the first day of every week

Biblical giving is regular and ongoing, not sporadic. God's will for His people is that they set something aside on the first day of each week. Maybe it works better to do it every two weeks or monthly. Timing isn't necessarily the point here. Christians will be consistent givers supporting the work of their church, even as they support others and the charities that serve them.

Of course, if our giving is to be regular, so are we. The church isn't after your money. We simply reflect God's desire to have you, all of you, living in a robust and healthy relationship with Him and His Holy Word.
