Seminary Call day occurred May 20. We have received news that we have received a graduate as the bulletin is being produced but will not have a name until it has been printed. We will have more information to share after our services this weekend and in next week's bulletin.

As we rejoice that the Lord of the church saw fit to grant a graduate here at St. Paul's, it is also good for us to realize that 77 churches submitted requests to the seminary and while all 33 men were assigned that means 44 churches did not receive a graduate. All total there are 100 pastoral vacancies remaining synod wide and about as many teaching vacancies. So, we continue to pray earnestly that they Lord of the Church would train and send workers into His harvest fields for the harvest is plentiful, but the workers truly are few. We continue to keep our brothers and sisters in Christ in our prayers as circuit pastors and circuits shoulder the burden of shortages throughout our synod.

A Note on Worship

Our summer schedule is once more up and running (Worship Times: Thursdays and Saturdays at 6:30pm and Sunday at 9:00am). We would love to see you all in worship regularly this summer as we discuss the life of the church, collectively and individually throughout the season of Pentecost.

We know there are many different comfort levels out there and have been trying to follow best practices from the area WELS churches as we go. This has not always been easy. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we all work through strange times, both when restrictions were more stringent and as things move more and more towards normal.

As you probably know masks are still recommended for the unvaccinated but no longer required by the state of Wisconsin (many mask mandates are being lifted in other states as well as risk levels drop). Fond du Lac has ended it restart program, no longer recommending restrictions on gathering sizes (indoor or out). Some high schools, public as well as private, are beginning to venture into mask optional models. Vaccines are now widely available for those who want them.

With all this in mind, the Fond du Lac WELS churches are moving towards more and more regular worship practices throughout the summer. Therefore, beginning in June, we will be removing the spacing from the center sections of the church. We may also slowly begin adding people for the Lord's Supper up front as numbers hopefully return to normal.

We understand that for some this may be moving a little faster than desired and for others a little slower, but options remain available. Thursday and Saturday in the summer have typically been well under capacity allowing for greater distancing among masked and unmasked individuals. The Narthex is also available with sound piped in via speakers and carrying out through the doors. Typically, you might even be the only one out there making it almost as "safe" as staying at home while enjoying "in-person" worship. For those who are simply unable to make it, the services will also remain streamed and downloadable online at stpaulslutherannfdl.com/video.

We continue to be grateful for the understanding and patience of our family here at St. Paul's as we continue to adjust and readjust to the constantly changing environment around us. As always, we remain confident that our Lord is in control of all things for the benefit of His people.
