Adapting: At times in our lives when everything gets turned on its head, we wish we could just go back to having everything be normal -- at least if normal for us was an easier or happier way of life. This is true when a loved one passes away who is very close to us. The rhythm and structure of our days and hours completely change. We live in a fog and it can take years to adapt. This is also true during this pandemic. We just want things to be the way they were. Of course, we know it's not that simple. In our society, we're used to few restrictions and being able to do pretty much what we want when we want. These are new times. While we are still more free than most of the world, we also have an obligation of Christian love (Romans 13:8) sometimes to do things differently for the well-being of others.
