God's Word This Week:

LIVING GENEROUSLY GOD OPEN'S OUR HEARTS

Today we begin a three-week stewardship emphasis. The word stewardship is often seen as a dirty word—a gimmick to get people to dig deeper and "give 'til it hurts." Nothing could be further from the truth! Instead, stewardship is a precious word that sums up the Christian life. It encourages us to be who we truly are in Christ: Precious people who have been richly blessed by a Father who knows how to give good gifts to his children!

Christians face a daily struggle. We have two paths set before us. The New Man, created within us at baptism, wants to live for Christ and the life that is to come. But our sinful nature focuses us on this life. That struggle pulls us in two directions when it comes to how we set our priorities or use our time. The struggle is especially noticeable when we wrestle with how to use the financial resources God has given us.

Last Week's Offerings

In thankfulness to God, we returned the following to the Lord: Current -\$8,225.14 (\$464.01 plate); Missions - \$751.50; Improvement - \$145; Mortgage -\$2,885.75; Good Friday - \$120; Easter - \$170; MLC Matching - \$1,327 (out of \$4,800 goal [\$1,632 so far]); Preschool Tuition - \$1,167.85; Extended Care -\$595; Altar Fund - \$25; Audio/Visual - \$20; WLA Tuition Assistance - \$100; Hand Chimes - \$20; St. Paul's Student Aid - \$30; Organ/Piano - \$10; Electronic funds included in these gifts - \$2,230.38; all offerings totaled \$15,592.24. What Does It Mean to Tithe?

God has a lot to say about giving and money in the Bible

- There are 500 verses on prayer, but over 2350 verses on giving & wealth.
- Almost half of Jesus' parables were about money or possessions.
- 1 out of every 10 Bible verses speak about the subject.
- Talking about money, possessions and giving is God's idea!

God has given us guidance about our giving

- The Apostle Paul instructed the Christians in Corinth about offerings "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up" (1 Corinthians 16:2).
 - o Regular giving is expected (first day of every week).
 - o Proportionate giving (in keeping with his income) is encouraged.
- In the Old Testament, God commanded His people to give a tithe. Ever since sin entered the world, God understood that humans could place their trust, hope or allegiance in money or possessions, types of gods. The tithing practice helped people to remember God's elevated position in their lives. Their tithes or gifts were a joyful response and recognition of God's grace. The tithe helped God's people to focus on trusting Him to provide for their future needs. "Return to me, and I will return to you," says the LORD Almighty. . . "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse." (Malachi 3:7, 10).
- How much is a tithe? A tithe literally means "10 parts of 100" or 10%. To illustrate, think of a loaf of bread with 10 thick slices. 10% of this loaf is one slice. Or, if someone works a day and is paid with ten, \$10 bills, one \$10 bill is a tithe. If this person worked a 10 hour day, 1 hour represents 10% of the work.
- God's people in the New Testament are free to decide on how much to give. The only requirement that God expects: all of our giving comes from the heart. "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Do a quick calculation in your mind. What dollar amount is a tithe for your family's income?

In the coming weeks, our congregation will be encouraging you to evaluate and prayerfully consider your giving a tithe (or other consistent percentage) for the next ten weeks with our **10 for 10** emphasis.

Firstfruit Giving . . .

a spiritual habit honoring God with the money we manage.

Proportionate Giving . . .

a spiritual habit reflecting faith and trust in God.

Generous Giving ...

taking a step of faith and trusting God at his Word. Proper motivation is found in the joy that God has for us.
