God's Word This Week

JUDGMENT PRODUCES PERSEVERANCE FOR THE SUFFERING.

While we wait and watch for Jesus' return, the better future He has promised us fills us with the hope we need. Not many would be inclined to picture judgment as an integral part of that better future. In fact, it is common to assume the opposite, that a better future for mankind would be one absent of all judgment. That kind of future, however, is a luxury many cannot afford. Our world is full of victims of abuse, violence, and oppression. In many cases, this evil goes unnoticed and unpunished. A future without hope of judgment would drive these victims either into total despair or to be consumed by the desire for revenge. A future that includes judgment, however, is a future that includes justice. It gives those who suffer at the hands of others the confidence that every wrong will eventually be righted. While Christians wait, we are by no means the only ones who suffer at the hands of others. We are, however, often among them. When we suffer, what are our options? Do we take matters into our own hands? Do we throw up our hands in despair? The better future that awaits offers a better option. We can patiently wait for God's perfect judgment, confident of where we stand with God through faith in our righteous Judge.
