Lutheran in Hutchinson, MN, *Jeanna & Layla Schultz* from Faith in Fond du Lac, WI, and one adult confirmation: *Brad Hiemstra*. We also rejoice in the eternal victories, while praying for the families who mourned their earthly passing: *Trisha Babler (8-10), Ed Stuhr (8-15), Chester "Jim" Kemnitz (8-23), Lois Cox (8-29), David Kemnitz (8-31), Joann Williams (9-7), and Jeff Krug (9-13).* 

*New Board Members* were voted in for the coming year (2024). On our Church Council Dean Preissner will be replaced by Larry Schultz, on the Board of Elders Ron Wilhelms will be replaced by David Jeffers, on the Board of Christian Education Paul Rivera & Randy Schoonover will be replaced by Travis Bortner and someone the Board will appoint in the future, on the Board of Properties Dave Jackson will be replaced by Tom Hagman.

*Our Mortgage* was renewed with NEBaT at 6.95% which moves our monthly payment from \$10,973.79 to \$13,073.67 for the next three years (\$1,267.924.03 remains on our mortgage).

The Board is looking into ways to reduce costs for the **2024 budget**. The motion was made, seconded, and passed to allow the Council to investigate and implement plans for potentially reducing our health insurance costs in the coming year as they are estimated to rise 11%.

**Special Service times** were also discussed. Our annual Hunter's Service is set for Wednesday, November 15<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM. Thanksgiving Services are Wednesday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 PM and Thursday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> at 9:00 AM. Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve Service also fall on Sundays this year. As a result, the decision was made to move the regular Sunday Services down to one 9:00 AM service followed by our regular Christmas Eve Services at 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM. Christmas Day at 9:00 AM and New Year's Eve at 6:30 PM.
