OCTOBER VOTERS' MEETING RECAP

In our October Meeting this past Sunday (10-30), we got quite a bit of work done. Financially, in the congregation, we are meeting our budgetary commitments so far and hope we will be able to finish strong even with some improvements that have been made to the facility as we seek to upkeep the physical blessings God has given. We ratified several membership changes, including welcoming WLA teachers Alex and Moriah Quist into the congregation. We also rejoiced that the Lord allowed us to be a part of two baptisms and an affirmation of Baptism in the past three months.

At the recommendation of our Church Council, it was decided to purchase a new Cannon Copier for \$8,102 to be taken from the improvement fund and to sign a service agreement with the Gordon Flesch Company.

We decided to add gutters and downspouts over the East Gym doors as well as some snow rail in the hopes of stopping the ice build-up by the exit doors there. This will be done for \$3,981 by Muza of Oshkosh.

It was also decided that we would contract Rob Giese Construction of Fond du Lac to install a catch basin by the patio where a fair amount of water has been collecting after rains and the like and which may be why we have had water enter the sanctuary twice. This catch basin will empty into the village storm sewer and the current downspout that empties there will be routed into this system as well. The total quoted cost is \$6,750.

We also voted in new board members for 2023. On the board of Trustees replacing outgoing member Dave Babler will be *Alan Geisthardt*. On the Board of Elders replacing outgoing member Jim Laudolff will be *Mark Peachy*. On the Board of Christian Education replacing outgoing members Tyler Dukelow & Tony Surian will be *Dustin Robinet & Tyler Schwefel*. Finally, on the Board of Properties replacing outgoing members, Mark Ewerdt will be *Jacob Slattery*. Board positions officially switch over after the installation of new members on Sunday, January 8, 2022, at our late Service. We would like to thank all our outgoing board members for the service given to St. Paul's and our God on the various boards. We are also thankful to all who submitted their names for positions.

Last but not least we had reminders about upcoming events scheduled for the month of November. November 17 Kevin Ehlke from WLA will meet with our council to update us on the building program. He is also planning on presenting an update to the congregation on December 10 & 11. Our annual Hunter's Service is scheduled for November 16 at 6:30 PM. Thanksgiving Services are set for November 23 at 6:30 PM and November 24 at 9:00 AM. Advent begins the weekend of November 27.
