Thanksgiving!

As I sit in the office contemplating what to write for the November newsletter, I'm struck by the fact that every holiday seems to celebrate something. And most, though I will admit that there are some holidays which are a lot harder to redeem, but most would seem to celebrate some truth of Scripture. Christmas and Easter are easy. Valentine's Day claims love and marriage. 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Veterans Day, Memorial Day, God's gifts given through Government. St. Patrick's Day maybe evangelism though its celebration has gone a bit off the rails. So what of Thanksgiving? What if I were to tell you that while thankfulness is certainly a part of the celebration of the day, what we're are truly doing is celebrating the most foundational truth of Stewardship or Vocation?

David in the very first verse of Psalm 24 tells us, The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it. Paul, that great theologian, whose time amongst the Pharisees had taught him Scripture like the back of his hand, echoes these words in the grand doxology of Romans 11:33-36, "33 Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out! 34 "Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor?" 35 "Who has ever given to God, that God should repay him?" 36 For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen."

Yes, all things come from God. He is the owner and we are the stewards and when we acknowledge this, when the little lightbulb turns on in our recesses of our mind, it changes everything.

First, the biggest and most quickly learned word in our vocabulary must disappear. Nothing is "mine". Everything really belongs to Him. The ability to work, the ability to rest, our jobs and the money they earn, the products and services we spend it all on and the places that sell them, spouse and children, home and car(s), clothes and the food I plan to eat, it's all God's! It's all lovingly provided from His bountiful hand.

Second, it inspires my thankfulness and praise. If everything we just said is true, then I suppose there is really no reason God should have given it to me. Allowed me to be so bold as to call it my own as He provided it as a gift. What could I ever provide in return? Certainly not my holiness, that was spoiled even before I took my first breath. Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me (Psalm 51:5). No we rightly lament with Job, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised (Job1:21)" No this is all grace just as the cross is grace. Just as forgiveness for all my selfishness and for my thunderous "mine"s is grace. Yes, may the name of the Lord be praise! To Him be glory forever and ever!

Third, it frees me! That thought seemed so weird the first time I heard it but it's true and it does. The "mine"s of this world, trap me in a prison of my own making. My hands grow tighter and tighter on all that I call mine and the fear of losing it intensifies with each new sparkling little precious thing. Like Gollum in Tolkien's Lord of the Rings it can so easily become consuming. But God opens my hand. Does it in the strangest of ways. He allows me to give it away! He allows me to return it to Him. He allows me to support the work of His Church. He allows me to help my neighbor. Oh, and because He is so giving and gracious, He allows me to use it to better myself, find enjoyment in life, even rejoice in rest. And for all this dear friends, we give thanks!



In this month of thanksgiving, it is good for us to pause and thank our God for the gifts He has given in all who serve. What a blessing He has given in all of you! Thanks for serving in 2024!

#### What Do These Numbers Mean?

This year to date we have not kept pace with our planned ministry expenses (budget). Our current fund savings (\$144,144.81) has been keeping us afloat so far. Our 3-year campaign Kickstarter for the Building Fund Building Fund (Church Mortgage) rebuilt our Mortgage Savings to \$41,007.94. After all the numbers come out in the wash, we are \$62,659.29 behind. That sounds large but if we divide it by all 400 giving units, \$160 per family would put us back on track.

As always, more important than money is our worship life. If this improves, we are confident the Lord of the church will take care of the whole money thing too. More than your money, we would love to see you in God's House for worship each week.
