## St. Paul's History - The congregation's first pastor (1902-1904)

In April 30, 1902, at the congregational meeting, it was unanimously decided to transfer the title of the church property to St. Paul's congregation, to assume the indebtedness of \$950.00, and to call its own pastor. Theological candidate Paul J. Dowidat was called, then ordained and installed on July 6, 1902, by his father, Pastor Chr. Dowidat, of Oshkosh. Because at this time the congregation numbered thirteen members, it could only raise \$100 annually for salary. Subsidy was granted by the Wisconsin Synod's Traveling Missionary's Fund (Reisepredigtkommission). (\$1 in 1902 is the same as \$36.66 in 2024!) After one and one-half year's service, Pastor Dowidat accepted a Call to serve in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and left on January 1, 1904.

### October Voters' Meeting - Tuesday, October 29, 2024 at 6:30 PM

We are moving our voters' meeting time to see if we can get more of our voters to meetings. Our Constitution stipulates (Section 1:3) that Voting members are those male communicant members (cf. 1 Corinthians 14:34; 1 Timothy 2:12) who have reached the age specified in the bylaws (18 years old), who have declared their agreement with our constitution and its bylaws, and who have been received into voting membership by the voter's assembly.

At our October Voters meeting, we vote in new board members for the coming year. If you are willing to serve on a board, please contact a pastor who will pass your name to the appropriate Board member.

**Stewardship Moment** from Stewardship: For the Care of Souls (p25-26)

There was only one vocation in the garden: that of steward. Like a hammer was created to drive a nail, people were created by God to serve as stewards. Stewardship's purpose does not begin with us. It begins in the creative power of God. He is the one who conceived this role. It is not an act of volunteerism or generosity. When stewards manage all of life and its resources for God's purposes, they are simply doing what they have been given to do. Only when there is synchronicity between identity and activity, purpose is realized, and joy ensues. We will never find this if we start our stewardship journey from the point of *what* stewards do. When we embrace our identity as stewards, reflecting God's image by the way we manage creation for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor, we are starting with our *why*. This aligns God's Word and our purpose, allowing the golden circle of stewardship to radiate from God, through us, to others. Stewards were made for this.

### **Last Week's Offerings**

We gave the following gifts - \$11,540.59 (\$191.51 plate); Missions - \$549.50; Improvement - \$115; Mortgage - \$1,485.75; Preschool Tuition - \$345; Extended Care - \$129.25; Audio/Visual Ministry - \$20 (Electronic funds included in these gifts - \$2,185.33; all offerings totaled \$14,185.09; Weekly Budgeted Target \$19,672.75). 285 souls attended worship (49, 77, & 159 [20 people streamed worship]). A Memorial was given to the Current Fund in loving memory of Dick Williams (8-28-2024).
