Mortgage Refinancing

Our church mortgage refinances every three years with National Exchange Bank. Our Board of Trustees was able to secure a 6.95% interest rate. Of course, this is still significantly higher than the 3% we were previously paying and will require us to consider our regular, planned thank offerings to the Lord as we go forward for the remainder of the year and into the next three.
