All are lost. Wandering around physically lost can lead to winding up in bad places. But the hard truth is that wandering around spiritually lost puts you in the worst place of all. Fortunately, Jesus does not leave us alone and lost in our sin. He relentlessly seeks us. He involves the rest of the Christian community in seeking the lost and rejoicing over the found.
