Adult Bible Starts This Week

After meeting Yahweh face to face on Mt. Sinai, Moses begins an important period of the Old Testament for the nation of Israel. In this class, we watch Moses grow from a helpless child in a basket to a strong leader of millions. We will study the 10 plagues, the Passover, the Red Sea Crossing, and more. Finally, we will take an in-depth look at why the Exodus is important for our understanding of Christ and the Gospel.

We plan on holding and processing the books on this end (placing stickers and bookmarkers within them) until their eventual placement into the pews perhaps around Lent of next year, as we slowly begin to get more familiar with the contents.

Hospitals and Visiting

Pastors often do not count as a visitor but rather as a caregiver (like a nurse or doctor). As always, even if they ask about your religious affiliation or church, even if they tell you they will contact us, in most cases they are not because of various rules and regulations about our privacy. To make sure we know you are there and at the very least can pray for you in illness, surgery, or recovery, please have a family member contact the church, or contact us yourself should you be able to let us know if you are in a care facility.

Where do my offerings go?

Anything given to the designation of Missions goes to pay our commitment to the <u>Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod</u>. Each year we designate an amount that we would like to give to the <u>Congregation Mission Offering</u>. CMO's gathered from all the congregations of the WELS Fund the sending out of Missionaries at home in the United States and in throughout our world. It also helps to fund the training of future called workers in our various synodical schools as well as covering all the stuff our current fund covers for us for our synod. If we gather more than we committed the money is always sent off to our synod. If we gather less than committed, it has been our practice to offset the difference from our Current Fund.

You may need to search for "North Fond du Lac" or "Fond du Lac" to find the church or the school accounts. To make sure that the apps don't double-dip during the transition, please cancel payment in "Giving Plus" as you transition to "Vanco Mobile" and restart your offerings/tuition in the new app. Remember, the Church account is for Offerings and the School account is for Tuition.
