## God's Word This Week

#### Pentecost 15 (Proper 20)

SERVE GOD WITH MONEY; YOU CAN'T SERVE GOD AND MONEY.

There are more than 2300 Bible passages that speak about money. Why? Money is a master Satan frequently tempts us to serve. He knows how successful his efforts with money can be. Money provides us with a false comfort and a sense of security. It serves as a source of pride. We use it's pursuit to justifying ourselves in our own eyes and the eyes of others. Jesus knows that serving money makes it impossible to serve God. The human heart is not big enough for both. As a result, Jesus does all he can to expose the futility of serving money. He also helps us see that the only one truly worth serving is our gracious, loving God. When we serve God, money is put in its proper place. Instead of money being a lord to serve, it becomes a resource for serving the Lord. This is the hard truth. There is no way for us to serve both God and money. But we can serve God with our money.

# **Bible Study: Hard Teachings for Hard Times**

Here, however, Jesus uses a parable involving money to address the way Christians use their money. He urges us to take a page from the unbelieving world! Be wise with your money! It's valuable! Not, however, in the way the unbeliever values it, as a master he serves. It's valuable, rather, as a means of proclaiming the Gospel. The money that we give to the Lord, through the church, enables seminary students to devote their time to study, missionaries to make the evangelism calls, and fledgling congregations to rent places to worship. God gives us temporary riches to use wisely to offer eternal riches.

Giving thanks for God, we presented these gifts: Current – \$9,098.41; Missions – \$595; Improvement – \$185.08; Mortgage – \$1,278; Preschool Tuition - \$433; Extended Care - \$448; Altar Fund - \$20; St. Paul's Student Aid – \$2; (Electronic funds included in these gifts – \$2,627.26; all offerings totaled \$12,059.64; Weekly target \$17,063). 332 souls attended our services (58, 52, & 222 [livestream – 35]).
